When the condition of the sick person deteriorates to the point where the doctors indicate not to continue treatment, it is obligatory for the family to ask a shailoh to a Rav as soon as possible to receive daas Torah at every step.

Do not allow testing for brain death. It is imperative for the family to refuse and to prevent the doctors from doing any test whose purpose is to determine if there is still activity in the brain stem. This includes tests called the apnea test, nuclear scan, "doll's eye" test, etc. (This also includes another test where they put cold water into the patient's ear).

Obligation Regarding the Treatment of a Patient Lacking Capacity.

Regarding a patient who lacks mental capacity, there are those who mistakenly claim that there is no obligation to provide the patient with the proper treatment necessary to save or sustain the patient's life. Therefore, we seek to clarify that, according to the Torah, there is an absolute obligation to treat a patient lacking capacity just as there is an obligation to treat a fully cognizant patient. Furthermore, it is an obligation to desecrate Shabbos for the rescue of such a patient, even if it is only to extend the life of the patient for a short time. Moreover, this also falls under the prohibition of "Do not stand idly by your fellow's blood", as explained in the Biur Halacha (*Siman 329*). It is a mitzvah to publicize this clear halachic ruling.
